The amount of the award is based on household income <u>and the respective public school corporation's per student appropriation.</u>

The value of the Choice Scholarship is the lesser of these amounts:

- 1) Tuition and fees charged to the student at the eligible school; or
- An amount based off the per-student state funding for the student's school corporation of residence, determined as 90% of the funding formula amount if household income is up to 400% of Federal free and reduced lunch (FRL) eligibility.
